About the Author

Having taken a course in creative writing at The College of Richard Collyer in Horsham, I've enjoyed writing numerous short stories, and I'm also a member of the Horsham Writers Circle.

So why did I write this particular story? I have a friend who lives in Bishopstone near Seaford on the south coast. She has been involved for a number of years in the renovation of the railway station. It's a real labour of love but it's a wonderful Grade II listed building in the art deco style. She was the founding member of FOBs – Friends of Bishopstone Station and last year they were finally able to gain access to the old parcel office which had been locked and abandoned for many years, with a view to restoring this room into a community hub.

When they pulled up the wooden shutters it revealed 'a hoard of vintage junk' including 1970s car parts, a fishing rod, rowing oars, British Rail advertising posters, wooden water skies, a 1980s skateboard and last but not least, a slightly scruffy looking teddy bear

It was the photo of the bear that inspired me to write Teddy and the adventures he had with Ian, the little boy who owned him, all those years ago, and ultimately to have the book published to raise much-needed funds for the continued restoration of the station.

All monies raised from the sale of the book are to be shared between FOBs and Cancer research.
